The Lone Peak Conservation Center is recruiting to fill a vacancy for a Dromedary Peak Type 2 Initial Attack Squad Leader position.

**FIRE TECHNICIAN II: Type 2 IA Squad Leader**  
**Salary Range: \$15.49 - \$23.25 based on experience, qualifications and training**

This is a funding limited, full time, permanent seasonal position with state benefits and retirement. **Assignment location:** Draper, Utah

### **The Position and Duties:**

The Utah Division of Forestry, Fire and State Lands (UT-FFSL) is seeking candidates to apply for Dromedary Peak Type 2 IA squad leader position. Competitive candidates will be physically fit, disciplined individuals who have demonstrated the ability to contribute in a team environment while leading and motivating firefighters. The successful candidate will have day-to-day working leadership responsibility for 5-10 squadmembers in a variety of settings including wildland fire, natural resource management and fuels mitigation projects. Responsibilities also include formal and on-the-job training, physical fitness conditioning, power saw, pump and vehicle operations. Other duties include personnel evaluations, timekeeping, billing, credit card reconciliation and use of Windows based computer software. The successful candidate will practice effective risk management in all operations and activities and will contribute to a culture that prioritizes safety in all crew undertakings.

### **Minimum Qualifications and Experience:**

FFT1, ICT5 and two seasons of fire experience.

Additional qualifications and experience will be considered in determining salary.

### **Crew Overview:**

Dromedary Peak was formed in 2007 and is staffed with one benefitted full time year round crew supervisor, 3 benefitted permanent seasonal squad leaders and 17 seasonal crewmembers. Dromedary Peak is available nationally from early May through mid-August dispatched by the Northern Utah Interagency Fire Center. Dromedary Peak's primary purpose and function is incident support, mainly wildland fire. When not assigned to incident support, the crew completes a variety of natural resource management and fuels mitigation projects in the state of Utah on a 40 hour per week schedule while maintaining on-call for incident support. These projects often involve self supported camping near project sites.

### **Details:**

Dromedary Peak ends its season in August each year allowing students to attend school. At this time permanent staff and remaining seasonal employees may extend their season by taking detail opportunities with other resources here at LPCC including Alta IHC, Lone Peak IHC, Twin Peaks IA, and our two type 3 engines. Permanent staff may also have an opportunity to diversify experience by detailing with state and federal partners.

### **On-Call Pay:**

While available for assignment, compensation for being on-call is one hour of base pay for every 12 hours on-call. When available during scheduled days off crewmembers must remain fit for duty and report to the station within 2 hours of receiving assignment.

### **Facilities:**

Dromedary Peak is based out of the Lone Peak Conservation Center in Draper, Utah. Facilities include two state of the art training/briefing rooms. Our base also includes crew and administration and offices, 100+ person equipment cache, saw shop, gym and lockers for personal items and gear storage.

### **Location and Accommodations:**

Lone Peak Conservation Center is located in the city of Draper, approximately 20 miles south of Salt Lake City. Salt Lake and the surrounding vicinity have a population of 1.2 million. Elevation at valley floor is 4230 feet. The area typically receives 16 inches of rain and 62 inches of snow annually. Average summer high temperature is 90 and winter low is 20 degrees. The Salt Lake area has a vast array of recreational opportunity including skiing, hunting, biking, hiking, boating and more. The area also has many high caliber educational institutions, a wide variety of quality restaurants and shopping options and a healthy economy.
